Changing your Will

If you have already made a Will and would now like to include a gift to the Royal Air Force Disabled Holiday Trust, you may find it easier to fill in this codicil form. A codicil is a supplement to a Will and allows you to amend your existing Will without drawing up a new one.

If you need to draft a new will, or wish to make substantial changes to your existing Will, we strongly recommend that you consult a solicitor. When amending shares of residue, we also recommend consulting a solicitor so as not to cause confusion in the future. Please do not write on or amend your existing Will as doing so may invalidate it.

* If you wish to make a gift of a share of residue then almost certainly a new Will is needed to avoid confusion. A gift of the entire residue may be very significant and we recommend independent legal advice to avoid confusion or a challenge to the codicil

** It is worth identifying what should happen if the specific item is sold, for instance by adding 'or its sale proceeds' or 'or its replacement'

What do I need to do?

1. Complete the form (but don't sign it until both your witnesses are present)
2. Ask two adults (of sound mind) to be witnesses. No-one who is your executor or a beneficiary in your Will or any codicil (or anyone married to, or in a civil partnership with, a beneficiary or executor) should be a witness
3. Sign the codicil in ink, using your normal signature, in the presence of both your witnesses
4. Ask both your witnesses to sign and complete their section of the codicil (in ink) in the presence of you and each other
5. Send your completed codicil to your solicitor or the person who is looking after your Will

Please remember

- You and your witnesses should be together, in each other's presence, when you sign the codicil and the witnesses attest
- Do not attach anything to your Will (such as paper clips or pins) as this may cause difficulties in proving your Will later on
- You must keep all codicil forms with your Will for them to be valid. Please ensure they are kept together or they will not be honoured.
- Banks and solicitors do not usually charge for storing a codicil with an existing Will.
